# Development, implementation, and use of a policy survey of local leaders in Vermont

Local leaders in Vermont were surveyed to assess their opinion on tobacco control policies. The policies with most support were preventing retailers from accepting coupons & increasing the tobacco excise tax. Many respondents were neutral about tobacco policy options, suggesting a need for further education & an opportunity to garner more policy support at the local level.

## Introduction


- The 2021 Vermont Local Opinion Leader Survey collected data on the opinions of local leaders in Vermont regarding substance use prevention policies for tobacco, alcohol, and cannabis. This is the third iteration of a survey that was also conducted in 2014 and 2017.
- The survey was a collaborative effort between the Tobacco Control Program and the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Program within the Vermont Department of Health (VDH).
- The study was conducted to:
  - Help VDH and partners understand which policies have broader support and which health problems are facing local communities.
  - Inform local discussions and decision-making on substance use prevention and control strategies and policies.
  - Equip VDH and partners with information about common arguments for or against different policy options, which can aid in education and policy promotion efforts.

# Methods


- Local leaders holding seven roles were exhaustively sampled Oct-Nov 2021:
  - Municipal: Mayor, Selectboard Chair,
     Town Manager
  - Planning: Regional Planning
     Commission Executive Director, Local
     Planning Commission Chair
  - Business: VT Chamber of Commerce
     Staff and Board Members
- 356 of 593 (60%) completed the survey either online or over the phone.

# Key takeaways

- For nearly all policies included in the survey, 20% or more respondents were neutral, suggesting an opportunity to educate around the importance of tobacco control policies and broaden the base of support.
- Common reasons for policy support or opposition can be used to tailor education and outreach
  efforts by VDH and partners at the local level.
